Coercive Intervention Techniques Not Covered (holding, rage, rage reduction, attachment or rebirthing therapies). Medicaid does not cover the use of "coercive techniques" where the therapist or others under the direction of the therapist use restraint other than for the protection of the child... Coercive interventions are sometimes also referred to as "holding therapy", "rage therapy", "rage reduction" therapy, "attachment therapy", or "rebirthing therapy."
